




Figure 7. BIRTH RATES TO TEENAGE MOTHERS BY COUNTY OF RESIDENCE, ALABAMA, 2020





ABORTION AND PREGNANCY INTENDEDNESS

Pregnancy intendedness

- 46%49% of ALL US pregnancies are unintended
- 82% of all teen pregnancies are unintended
- 12% of Alabama teen pregnancies in 2020 ended in abortion







RISKS OF ADOLESCENT PARENTING

- To child

 - Sons are 13% more likely to go to prison
 - Daughters are 22% more likely to become pregnant before age 20
 - Health
- To teen
 - Educational
 - Economic
 - Mental Health
 - Isolation
 - Health
